Do You Know About Proton Therapy?


- 1 Proton therapy has a highly therapeutic effect with less damage to the healthy tissue, because the radiation is focused on the cancerous tissue.
- 2 The body' function and shape can be maintained well in comparison to surgery.
- 3 It makes treatment possible even if the cancer is near organs that are easily affected by radiation.
- Compared to surgery, it reduces the burden on the body and is a gentle way to help heal those that are older.
- Since the burden on the body is reduced, the patient can be an outpatient and get treatment even if they are still working.

What is a proton beam?

Protons are extracted from a hydrogen atom by removing an orbital electron, and accelerated at a desired speed by an accelerator, that we call a proton beam.

What is proton beam therapy?

Up until now, X-rays used for conventional radiotherapy deliver the highest radiation near the skin surface of patient body, and the radiation decreases as X-rays penetrate the body deeply. On the other hand, a proton beam can deliver the highest radiation at the depth of the cancer tissue and no radiation behind that. Thus proton therapy can provide more conformal radiation to the cancer in comparison to conventional X-ray radiotherapy.


How to get a medical examination

If you were diagnosed with cancer at your local hospital, and wish to be treated through proton therapy, then the attending physician at your local hospital needs to send the necessary examination data as well as their prognosis to our Proton Therapy Center. Our center's doctors will then make a decision.

If the doctor decides that the patient is a candidate for proton therapy, then the patient will come to the Proton Therapy Center and receive treatment. After the treatment is finished, the patient will return to their local hospital for periodic check-ups on their progress.
